**RESOLUTION**

**WHEREAS**, prescription painkiller, heroin and other opioid addiction remains a serious public health issue across Ohio and the nation; and

**WHEREAS**, individuals with a primary diagnosis of opioid addiction now account for more than one-third of Ohioans in publicly-funded addiction treatment; and

**WHEREAS**, Neonatal Abstinence Syndrome (NAS) refers to a group of health conditions that occur in a newborn exposed to opiates while in the mother's womb; and

**WHEREAS**, babies with NAS experience irritability, low birth weight, breathing problems, tremors and seizures, feeding difficulties and other health-related challenges; and

**WHEREAS**, the rate of NAS increased 800 percent between 2004 and 2013; and

**WHEREAS**, inpatient costs associated with treating NAS totaled more than \$99 million in 2013; and

**WHEREAS**, the State of Ohio has made fighting substance abuse and addiction a priority and is committed to promoting environments and compassionate care that gives every newborn the best-possible start in life; and

**WHEREAS**, the Maternal Opiate Medical Support (MOMS) pilot program and Ohio Perinatal Quality Collaborative are shining examples of ways Ohio is working to standardize treatment for babies with NAS, reduce costly, extended hospital stays, strengthen support for mothers and babies, and improve early identification, screening and training around NAS; and

**WHEREAS**, prevention education, public awareness and knowledge of available treatment resources are crucial to reduce the physical, social and economic impact of NAS.

**NOW, THEREFORE, We, John R. Kasich and Mary Taylor, Governor and Lieutenant Governor of the State of Ohio, do hereby recognize July 1-7, 2015 as**
