David Jobes, Ph.D., ABPP

David A. Jobes is a Professor of Psychology and Associate Director of Clinical Training at The Catholic University of America; he is also an Adjunct Professor of Psychiatry, School of Medicine, Uniformed Services University of the Health Sciences. His research and writing on suicide has produced numerous peer reviewed publications (including five books on clinical suicidology). As an internationally recognized suicidologist, Dr. Jobes is a past President of the American Association of Suicidology (AAS) and was a recipient of that organization's 1995 "Shneidman Award" in recognition of early career contribution to suicide research. Dr. Jobes also received the 2012 AAS "Dublin Award" in recognition of career contribution in suicidology. He has served as a research consultant to the Centers for Disease Control and Prevention and has been a consultant to the Institute of Medicine of the National Academy of Sciences, the FBI, the Department of Defense, and Veterans Affairs. Dr. Jobes is member of the Scientific Council of the American Foundation for Suicide Prevention (AFSP) and he is a Fellow of the American Psychological Association. Board certified in clinical psychology (American Board of Professional Psychology), Dr. Jobes also maintains a private clinical and forensic practice at the Washington Psychological Center

Colin Fowler, LPCC-S

Mr. Fowler has his MS in Social Agency Counseling from the University of Dayton, licensed as a Professional Clinical Counselor with supervisory credentials. He has over twenty years in the human services field. He has worked for county children services, the juvenile court as well as private foster care agencies, outpatient mental health, group home settings, & secure residential programs. Currently he is Psychological Health Coordinator for the Ohio Army National Guard; he has trained in Ohio, South Carolina, Tennessee, and Ontario.
