

The Addiction Treatment Program (ATP) Information Sheet

- The following fourteen counties started in the ATP in FY 2016: **Allen, Clinton, Cuyahoga, Franklin, Gallia, Hamilton, Hardin, Hocking, Jackson, Marion, Mercer, Montgomery, Summit, and Warren.**
- The ATP expanded to the following eight counties in FY 2017: **Butler, Clermont, Lake, Lorain, Lucas, Mahoning, Stark, and Trumbull.**
- **Eligibility Criteria for the ATP:**
 1. Client must be enrolled in a certified drug court in one of the counties listed above.
 2. Client must have an opioid and/or alcohol addiction.
 3. Client must be deemed eligible for Medication-assisted treatment (MAT).
- **MAT eligible clients include:**
 1. Individuals who qualify for MAT but opt to not use medication.
 2. Individuals who qualify for MAT and opt to utilize the medication.
- **Funding:**
 - Each ATP client may use \$2000 per month.
 - Funds may be utilized to cover both treatment (MAT, counseling, etc) and recovery supports.
 - Providers are permitted to move funds between clients when necessary and allow the utilization of leftover funds from one client to be spent on another client that may have expenses that exceed \$2000.
 - Funds flow through the ADAMHS Board and are disbursed to participating providers.
- **Recovery Supports:**
 - Assistance intended to help an individual with addiction or mental health needs to initiate and sustain recovery.
 - Examples of recovery supports include, but are not limited to: housing, transportation, work boots, child care, co-pays for private insurance.
 - Funding must first cover treatment expenses and can then be utilized for recovery supports.
- **Treatment Research Institution (TRI) Evaluation and data entry:**
 - The eight new counties added to the ATP in FY2017, will not be part of the evaluation conducted by TRI and therefore will not enter any data into the TRICEP system.
 - The fourteen current counties that began the ATP in FY2016, will continue to track their data in TRICEP as they have already been doing.
