

## SFY 2014 Community Innovations Project Overviews



### Butler, Clinton, Highland, Pike, Preble, Warren

Collaborative Partners include:

#### **Project Summary:**

This pilot project will provide a comprehensive outpatient competency restoration program for adults who are court-referred for restoration from any court jurisdiction within the Forensic Center catchment area. Scope of services include: Psycho-educational sessions, development of positive coping skills and stress/anxiety management, communication and problem solving skill development; and medication management/maintenance for those who are psychiatrically stable.

#### **Project Outcomes:**

- Provide restoration services in the community to 12 defendants.
- Reduce the number of Forensic Bed Days used by defendants from within the catchment area.
- Provide this service to at least two counties within the catchment area.



#### **Project summary:**

This pilot project will use funds to screen adults in the Multi County Correctional Center, provide an assessment and then navigate the individual from the jail to the Marion Area Counseling Center for mental health and substance use treatment. Youth in the Juvenile Detention Center will be screened and those in need of treatment will be linked to Marion Area Counseling Center.

#### **Proposed Outcomes:**

- Marion Area Counseling Center will implement three evidenced based outpatient programs.
- The court will also be implementing *Thinking for a Change* for youth incarcerated in the Juvenile Detention Center.
- 60 youth will be served with this program over the course of a year.



## **Hamilton**

### **Project Summary:**

This pilot project will use Central Clinic's Alternative Interventions for Men (AIM) to operate as a diversion program by providing mental health and/or substance abuse services to 85 to 100 non-violent men who are involved in the county's adult criminal justice system. AIM will use the Men's Trauma and Recovery Empowerment (MTREM) model to improve men's coping and interpersonal skills so that they are better equipped to resolve conflicts and other stressors that result in drug use and criminal activity.

### **Project Outcomes:**

- A 48% no-new-arrest rate of the men served.
- A rate of 48% for both abstinence and treatment completion of the men served.
- 30% for securing housing and 20% employment of the men served.


### **Project summary:**

This pilot project will use funds to advance the "Shared Framework for Reducing Recidivism and Promoting Recovery" which was developed by the National Institute of Corrections, Council of State Governments Justice Center, and the Bureau of Justice Assistance. The Framework weaves together the science on risk and needs to provide and approach to achieve better outcomes for adults in contact with the criminal justice system with substance use disorders, mental illness, or both.

Inmates will be provided an assessment and then will be placed into specific groups based on a combination of criminogenic risk, substance abuse and mental illness. Once an individual is placed in a group, a reentry plan is developed specific to the individual.

### **Proposed outcomes:**

- Justice Center and Century Health staff will be trained on how to implement the Shared Framework for Reducing Recidivism and Promoting Recovery model.
- Policies will be changed at the Justice Center to implement the model, forms will be developed for tracking and an assessment tool will be identified.
- Recidivism rates will be tracked and reduced by 15%.
- Peer Support services will be added to Century Health Staff.



## **Lucas**

### **Project summary:**

The pilot project will enhance and expand the existing Forensic Linkage Program with LCCC and TMC. TASC staff will work with offenders that have a serious mental illness and misdemeanor charge and advocate to the judge for assessment/treatment services on behalf of the clients. The judge may then decide to order treatment as a condition of release. TASC can then meet with the individual back at jail prior to being released and proceed with an expedited diagnostic assessment, and brief case management support, to include linkage to the community mental health center (CMHC). TASC staff will update the court regarding the individual's progress and compliance with services.

### **Proposed outcomes:**

- Clients will be less likely to be rearrested as a result of being linked with needed mental health services as a condition of their release.
- Increase in the number of individuals with severe mental illness referred to treatment as a condition of release.
- Decrease in the number of rearrests within six months of release.

## **Mahoning**



### **Project Summary:**

This project will serve a total of 175 mentally ill criminally involved individuals with replicable, best practice programming. Turning Point Counseling Services will provide 20 hours per week of expanded and enhanced healthcare services. Treatment options available for program participants may include individual counseling, group counseling, and community psychiatric support treatment.

### **Project Outcomes:**

- Provide mental health case consultation to the staff of Community Corrections Association to assist them in identifying and helping 175 residents with mental illness.
- Provide de-escalation services to residents of Community Corrections Association thereby decreasing the number of residents referred to the emergency room for hospitalization.
- Provide evidence based Cognitive Behavioral Therapy services to 150 Community Corrections Association residents to assist them in managing mental health symptoms.
- Provide linkage to community resources for 100 program completers for continued service delivery.



## **Montgomery**

### **Project Summary:**

This project will provide a holistic and comprehensive plan for providing services pre-release with successful linkages to services post-release. Individuals assessed as being at the highest-risk, based upon their mental health and substance abuse status as well as criminogenic profile, will be referred to individual and/or group counseling provided by a Master's level licensed therapist positioned at the jail. Services will continue post-incarceration to ensure continuity of care and will be coordinated by case managers. In additions, case management services will be provided by Miami Valley Housing Opportunities for the homeless population.

### **Project Outcomes:**

- Increased linkage to the behavioral health system of care.
- Reduction in recidivism.
- Increased stabilization of mental health symptoms.
- Reduction of substance abuse relapse.



### **Project summary:**

This pilot project will expand the current Treatment Accountability for Safer Communities (TASC) program that serves the juvenile population to include the adult population. The target population will be adult male and female non-violent offenders, ages 18 to 29 years old. TASC will provide a certified assessment, urinalysis testing and case management services.

### **Proposed Outcomes:**

- Clients will remain abstinent.
- Clients will incur no new arrests at the completion of treatment.



## **Seneca, Sandusky, Wyandot, Erie, Ottawa, Huron**

### **Project summary:**

This pilot project would fund mental health services in each county jail. Firelands will offer mental health services that are tailored to the identified needs of each inmate including one or more of the following services: diagnostic assessment, individual therapy, group therapy, CPST services, and pharmacological management.

### **Proposed outcomes:**

- Reduced recidivism rates.
- Reduced crisis intervention services provided at the jails.
- Reduced psychiatric hospitalizations.


### **Project Summary:**

This project will hire a full time reentry coordinator/case manager within the jail to establish a reentry plan, schedule community appointments, and provide initial intake documentation for the receiving agencies. In addition, when appropriate, inmates will receive a long acting injectable medication to serve as a "bridge dose" until meeting with the community provider.

The target population for this program will be offenders with opiate dependence and/or psychosis.

### **Project Outcomes:**

- Increase Efficacy of Referral
- Increase use of bridge medication, specifically long acting injectables
- Decrease opiate relapse within 30 days of release
- Lower Recidivism



## **Tuscarawas/Carroll**

### **Project Summary:**

This project will develop a collaborative legal and behavioral health intervention team targeting indigent offenders with a substance abuse/dependence history. The team will consist of a probation officer, lead clinician, and a community navigator and will maintain responsibility for the planning, monitoring, and drug and alcohol treatment of the court-ordered individuals. Priority will be given to those charged with domestic violence with a child under the age of 18 in the home.

### **Project Outcomes:**

- 70% of the individuals that engage in services past the first month will complete the treatment program.
- 85% of the individuals will identify a primary care physician or accept a referral to a primary care physician.
- 75% of the individuals will not receive a new charge during their course of treatment.
- 75% of the individuals will not receive a new charge within one year of successful discharge from treatment.

### **Project Summary:**

This Project will use the Screening, Brief Intervention, and Referral to Treatment tool (SBIRT) combined with the use of the MI SAMHSA\_HRSA on line screening tools for Depression, Bipolar, and Anxiety disorder and suicide risk assessment. Coordinators will conduct and coordinate correctional screening and arrange and coordinate discharge planning.

### **Project Outcomes:**

- Increased linkages with Specialty Court Dockets
- Increased continuity of care to decrease both criminal recidivism and hospitalization for persons involved in the criminal justice system.
- Successful transition from jail to community life through linkage with the Wayne/Holmes Reentry Coalition for housing, employment, education, etc.
