**Meeting Minutes**

**I. Old Business/Reporting:**

- a. **Minutes:** Minutes approved for September 2, 2016
- b. **Membership:** C Kasha-Ciallella led the group through several membership applications. Group agreed to invite A. Ferguson, Executive Director of the OCDPB to be an Ex-Officio member. This will help align roundtable work with licensure changes. Group will invite other applicants to November meeting. The group agreed to ensure geographic diversity to ensure rural participation. Due to underrepresentation from clinicians in rural western Ohio, OMHAS will send out an e-update requesting applications from that region. Those applications, when received will be reviewed at upcoming meetings.
- c. **Talbot Hall:** B. Lander walked the committee through the Talbot Hall template for Treatment Plans and Progress notes. Benefits discussed include: Client Centered approach, moving with the clients. Further, the consolidated design reduces clinician paperwork.
  - i. **Next Steps:** Determine if documentation templates comply with OMHAS documentation standards.
- d. **State Opiate Initiatives:** A. Boxil updated committee on movements to increase coordination of Local Task Forces. There is an upcoming multi state Judicial Symposium relative to the epidemic.

**III. Future Agenda Items:**

- a. The groups agreed to have a future agenda item to illuminate barriers and best practices regarding opiate involved adolescents (e.g. detox, MAT's):
- b. Increase role of Roundtable to vet/disseminate Ohio Based Best practices. Efforts would involve:
  - i. Develop a brief abstract for providers to illustrate an internal "Best Practice."
  - ii. Post e-update letter explaining the process
  - iii. Periodically release announcements by target area/ domain (e.g. reducing assessment paperwork, decreasing no-shows, etc.)
  - iv. Vet submissions via a standing agenda item in the roundtable
  - v. Selected responses to be posted on the Roundtable webpage.

IV. **Institute for Human Services:** B. Boyer, from HIS, offered update and discussion on child protection agency initiatives. Invited by the committee to explore potential to collaborate and cross train CSB workers on opiate related issues and treatments. PCSO recently drafted a “white paper” on their policy goals. This includes recruiting of topic expert trainers for the CSB system. She shared information on a “continuum vision,” statewide system reform projects, and expansion of family drug courts.

V. **Follow-up Items:**

- a. **Status Update in Case Closure rules.** Group agrees with a rule change, consistent with ROSC, that accommodates “recovery checkups post case closure.
- b. **White Paper:** Request copy of the PCSO White Paper relative to opiate involved clients in Child Protection venues.
- c. J. Ellis to bring information on **Sequential Intercept Model (CCOE-CJ).**
- d. Continue to have issues with Cash Pay DATA 2000 practices. Follow up on whether Ohio can adopt the Kentucky Model- If using Medicaid to fill Buprenorphine rx, must show Medicaid billing from prescriber.
