

**Ohio Department of Mental Health and Addiction Services
Mental Health Clinical Roundtable
TEAM CHARTER**

Purpose	The Ohio Department of Mental Health and Addiction Services (OhioMHAS) Mental Health Clinical Roundtable will provide clinical advice and practical guidance to the Director and Medical Director to assist in developing standards for treatment and treatment policies; to provide guidance on emerging issues or concerns; to promote integrated care and early intervention; and to interact and collaborate with the Prevention and Addiction Clinical Roundtable priorities.		
Governance	Two Community Co-Chairs; 20 total members		
Geographical Representation	The Round Table will have representation from all regions of the state of Ohio, including metropolitan, suburban, rural, Appalachian and mixed areas.		
Leadership	Roundtable Co-Chairs shall serve a one term or longer to assure continuity. <u>Responsibilities include:</u> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Setting the Roundtable agenda • Identifying emerging issues for discussion • Distributing information and communications materials in collaboration with OhioMHAS • Providing oversight, guidance and support to the workgroups 		
Membership Qualifications	Members scope of experience to include clinical, programmatic, scientific/research in the treatment or support of persons with mental health disorders (children and/or adult); 80% of members must have five years or more experience in an inpatient, outpatient, public or private clinical setting; 20% of members with other relevant experience (recovery supports, primary care, etc.). Members will represent a statewide/regional organization or association to broaden the input and impact of the Roundtable. OhioMHAS leadership may designate ad hoc members based on current department priorities and initiatives.		
Term Length	Two year term with optional renewal; terms shall be staggered to promote continuity of initiatives.		
Meetings	The full Roundtable will meet on a quarterly basis in various locations throughout the state. Each workgroup will determine the frequency of their meetings based on priorities. The Roundtable will meet with the Prevention and Addiction Clinical Roundtables bi-annually to facilitate coordination and collaboration of projects.		
Workgroups	Workgroups can be assigned projects by the Roundtable, the Director or Medical Director through the Roundtable. Each workgroup will have a designated lead, with OhioMHAS staff support and subject matter experts. Workgroups will be encouraged to meet regularly and coordinate activities with the full Roundtable.
