## >>> OhioMHAS Grants and Funding Management System – Go Live July 1

The Ohio Department of Mental Health and Addiction Services (OhioMHAS) is pleased to announce that the new Grants and Funding Management System (GFMS) will be active on **July 1**. The system provides a means for ADAMH/ADAS/CMH Boards (Boards), providers and other entities awarded grants by OhioMHAS to apply for funding, provide progress on identified outcomes, report expenditures and to draw-down funds. Providers and Boards that receive funding from the department are able to apply for grant funding and process allocation funds within GFMS.

- User accounts have been brought over from other OhioMHAS applications (OLGA and POPS) and there is no need to register for the application; however, you will need to click on the link “I forgot my password” in the login screen to establish yourself in GFMS. Users not connected with a previous OhioMHAS system will need to establish a new account.
- Board allocation funding managed through GFMS will be entered by OhioMHAS fiscal staff by Wednesday, **July 6**. At that time, Boards may begin the process of entering Allocation Applications. As was discussed in training, this “Allocation Application” is a confirmation and/or updating of basic board information such as CEO, addresses, etc., and the uploading of signed Assurance & Agreement documents. First quarter push out funds will be distributed to the Boards by the last week of July for Boards that have submitted their signed Assurance & Agreement documents **by July 15**.
- Prevention programs receiving Board allocations will make applications in GFMS (similar to the process in POPS) for prevention allocation funding as it aligns with SAMHSA recommendations to the department.
- The grant application and funding process is fully open on July 1. This includes grants found on the GIFA as well as the Allocation-Type spreadsheet. Please note a process change for pass through grants (grants where the funding passes through the Board). In GFMS, the grantee will draw available funds through the Funding tab. The OhioMHAS Project Lead will approve and identify the grant as a pass through and notification of the draw down will be on the Board's dashboard for disbursement.
