MITTS BITS

Behavioral Health Claims for Consumers with Third Party Insurance or Medicare

Providers have alerted us to an increasing number of errors in claims submitted for clients who have insurance coverage other than Medicaid. It is important to remember that MITTS requires third party coverage information on ONLY the following codes:

- 90862- Pharmacologic Management
- 90801- Psychiatric diagnostic interview
- All J codes for office administered medications

Claims submitted with values in the TPL or Medicare fields will cause MITTS to use those values in claims adjudication. Providers should include values in the TPL or Medicare fields for ONLY the services listed above. Claims for other services should have the TPL and Medicare fields LEFT BLANK.

Change in Requirements for EDI Test Files – ODJFS staff just learned this week that **EDT test files must now contain claims with dates of service 7/1/12 and after**. EDI Testing Statistics – Of the 269 behavioral health entities who have requested trading partner status to submit claims via Electronic Data Interchange (EDI) transactions, 173 of those have become certified. Trading partner applicants who chose to discontinue testing may still submit claims to MITTS using the MITTS Web Portal or by contracting with an already certified Trading Partner. EDI Testing continues for the remaining 91 entities seeking trading partner status.

Solution Underway for Eligibility Conflicts between MACSIS and MITTS

Providers have continued to have difficulties with claims for dates of service prior to 7/1/12 in which there is a conflict in Medicaid eligibility status in MITTS and in MACSIS. ODJFS staff is working in conjunction with MITTS Vendor Hewlett Packard and representatives of ODMH and ODADAS to design a fundamental correction for this problem. However, implementation of this fix is not scheduled until September/October 2012. In the interim, providers with claims in which there is a conflict in Medicaid eligibility status between MITTS and MACSIS are asked to submit a list of problem claims by contacting Theresa Rohrbaugh at Theresa.Rohrbaugh@mh.ohio.gov or Monica Burke at Monica.Burke@ada.ohio.gov.
