5122-29-32 **Substance use disorder residential treatment services.**

(A) A substance use disorder (SUD) residential treatment service is a medical or non-medical treatment service located in a twenty-four-hour rehabilitation facility. The SUD residential treatment service provides a planned service of directed by independetly licensed professionals evaluation, care, and treatment for the restoration of functioning. The rehabilitation facility may be affiliated with or located within a hospital, as part of the inpatient/residential continuum or may be in a freestanding facility.

A facility providing medical treatment shall have twenty-four-hour-a-day medical or nursing monitoring.

(B) Each SUD residential treatment service provider certified by the Ohio department of mental health and addiction services (OhioMHAS) shall provide:

(1) An American society of addiction medicine (ASAM) 3.1 level of care or greater.

(2) Food for clients, to include at least three nutritionally-balanced meals and at least one nutritious snack per day, seven days per week.

(3) The opportunity for clients to get eight hours of sleep per night.

(4) A staff member who is at the provider site to actively supervise and monitor clients twenty-four hours per day, seven days per week.

(C) A SUD residential treatment service provider may provide treatment to individuals for whom the level of care specified in paragraph (B)(1) of this rule is not clinically indicated upon assessment.

~~(D)~~ (D) SUD residential treatment services shall be provided in facilities that are clean, safe, and therapeutic.

~~(E)~~ (E) Time for meals, unstructured activities, free time, or time spent in attendance of self-help groups, such as alcoholics anonymous or narcotics anonymous shall not be considered for the purposes of meeting ASAM level of care requirements for services.

~~(F)~~ (F) Interpersonal and group living skills shall be promoted in SUD residential treatment. Clients shall be transitioned to the general community for education, job training, job interviews, employment stabilization and obtaining alternative living arrangements.

(1) A service provider may require clients to perform tasks of a housekeeping nature without compensation as specified within service provider guidelines.

(2) Housekeeping tasks shall not be considered for the purposes of meeting ASAM level of care requirements for services.

~~(G)~~ (G) Each SUD residential treatment service provider shall be organized and clinically managed to provide non-medical community residential level of care. Non-medical community residential treatment means a twenty-four hour rehabilitation facility without twenty-four hour-per-day medical or nursing monitoring.

(H) Each SUD residential treatment service provider shall provide, at a minimum, the following certified services in accordance with Chapter 5122-29 of the Administrative Code:

(1) Assessment services;

(2) Counseling services;

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(3) Crisis intervention services; and,

(4) Coordination and support services.

~~(G)~~ (I) A SUD residential treatment service provider that has twenty-four hour per day nursing or medical staff may provide one or more of the following levels of care:

(1) Medical community residential.

(2) Twenty-three hour observation bed to paragraph (B) of rule 5122-29-10 of the Administrative Code.

(3) Sub-acute detoxification pursuant to paragraph (A) of rule 5122-29-09 of the Administrative Code.

~~(H)~~ (J) A health history, including food allergies and drug reactions, shall be completed on or before admission to a residential or halfway house treatment service provider.

(1) Physical examinations by a physician, clinical nurse specialist or certified nurse practitioner shall be obtained within a reasonable amount of time in accordance with the individual's needs not to exceed twenty-one calendar days of admission.

(2) A physician, clinical nurse specialist or certified nurse practitioner may accept a physical examination that has been done ninety days or less before the admission date of a client; however, a copy of the physical examination must be filed in the client's record and the individual accepting the physical exam must date and sign the physical examination.

(3) Each service provider shall refer a client for tuberculosis, hepatitis type B and C, and human immunodeficiency virus (HIV) screening when indicated.

(4) Service providers shall ascertain if pregnant clients are receiving prenatal care and document who is providing prenatal care.

(a) If a client is not receiving prenatal care, a service provider is required to offer assistance in obtaining prenatal care.

(b) If a client refuses to obtain prenatal care, the service provider shall document in her clinical record that she was offered assistance to obtain prenatal care.

(K) Each SUD residential treatment service provider organized to serve individuals under the age of eighteen shall provide services in a manner that is developmentally appropriate, addresses educational needs, promotes family involvement, and meets the specific developmental needs of the youth.
