Map Information:

This map represents the percentage of unduplicated clients in treatment who list heroin as a primary drug of choice by county of residence. In SFY 2012, 8,509 clients (15.2%) listed this substance as a primary drug of choice. Counties with the highest percentages of clients reporting heroin as a drug of choice were Marion (47.1%), Knox (36.4%) and Hardin (28.2%). Paulding (0.0%), Lawrence (1.0%) and Holmes (1.8%) counties had the fewest clients reporting this drug of choice.

Note: Alcohol, Drug Addiction and Mental Health Services (ADAMHS) Boards have black borders, and counties have white borders. Borders are black in cases where ADAMHS boards and counties have the same borders.
