

# Prescription Opioids as a Primary Drug of Choice

## Map Information:

This map represents the percentage of unduplicated clients in treatment who list prescription opioids as a primary drug of choice by county of residence. In SFY 2010, 5,891 clients (9.0%) listed this substance as a primary drug of choice. Counties with the highest percentages of clients reporting prescription opioids were Scioto (68.0%), Lawrence (57.6%) and Jackson (57.1%). Holmes (0.0%), Van Wert (0.6%) and Shelby (1.1%) counties had the fewest clients reporting this drug of choice.

Note: Alcohol, Drug Addiction and Mental Health Services (ADAMHS) Boards have black borders, and counties have white borders. Borders are black in cases where ADAMHS boards and counties have the same borders.
