




Target Population

- A. Individual with SUD diagnosis released from ODRC after July 1, 2016 who have participated in Recovery Service Programming while incarcerated in an ODRC institution.
- B. Individual with SUD diagnosis released from ODRC who have participated in Therapeutic Community.
- C. Individuals release from Transitional Control or the ODRC Treatment Transfer Program that participated in the above programs.



Housing Interventions and CSH



the Corporation for Supportive Housing will manage the housing benefit for CTP on behalf of CareSource

- CSH's role:
 - Creating a network of regional housing brokers to recruit housing providers and landlords (including Recovery Housing)
 - Establishing policies and procedures to govern eligibility benefit
 - Provide training and support to ensure quality of housing programs and services
 - Participate on management team for CTP demonstration and support evaluation of various intervention approaches



Types of housing covered by CTP

- Transitional Crisis Housing
- Recovery Housing
- Rapid Re-housing/ Supportive Housing

Housing Goals

- Prevent recidivism through stable housing with appropriate community-based supports
- Create person-centered supports that enable movement across intervention types while remaining within budget constraints
- Learn from data
