Housing stability is a common challenge for individuals with behavioral health disorders. Knowing how to help people (residents) consider and embark upon behavior change that promotes stable housing is an important skill for all housing providers to have. Other important skills include effective listening and communication skills and understanding how people consider and make changes in their lives.

This training will teach housing providers how to recognize stages of change among residents and how to use a stage-based approach in their conversations. We will learn effective listening and communication skills. We will also learn how to identify ineffective communication strategies—ones that reduce or interfere with helpful conversations. Participants will have an opportunity to apply the stages-of-change construct in their current work with residents. They will also have the opportunity to observe and/or practice effective listening and communication skills.
