PROGRAM DESCRIPTION:

The Ohio Department of Mental Health and Addiction Services and The Ohio State University Wexner Medical Center are pleased to co-sponsor the 2015 Annual Forensic Conference for a broad range of professionals who work with people with mental illness involved in the justice system.

In the morning, **The Premise of Criminalization and the Promise of Offender Rehabilitation: Reentry, Recidivism and Recovery** will be delivered by keynote speaker Merrill Rotter, MD, Associate Clinical Professor of Psychiatry and Director of the Division of Law and Psychiatry for the Department of Psychiatry, Albert Einstein College of Medicine.

New this year is an **Ethics Track** dealing with forensic report writing, bias in forensic evaluations, and the ethics of providing treatment to people in the criminal justice system. An array of **11 workshops** will address such topics as: outpatient competency restoration; housing options; supported employment opportunities; the new guardianship rules; forensic monitoring; and research on offenders with intellectual disabilities and mental illness. The **Forensic Consumer Panel** — a highlight of previous forensic trainings — will be included, as will our perennial **Legal Update**, presented this year by Joy Stankowski, MD, and Douglas Mossman, MD.
