Welcome

Dawn welcomed the committee members to the conference call. Dawn took attendance and then asked the committee to review the meeting minutes from the May 15, 2013 meeting. Kathie Chaffee made a motion for the minutes to be approved as written and Judi Moseley seconded the motion. The minutes from 5/15/13 meeting were accepted as written.

Training Updates

Dawn Thomas gave an update on training. She mentioned that Global Insight has not received a great deal of training requests lately and the focus has been on providing technical assistance to the sub-recipient communities as they continue to work the SPF process. Global has provided technical assistance to the communities through the taping of their logic model webinar presentations. Global Insight worked with Amanda Conn Starner from the Coalition for a Drug Free Greater Cincinnati on a webinar series on Media/Marketing Strategies. This webinar series was created at the request of several SPF SIG coalitions who are utilizing media strategies for their SPF SIG projects.

SEOW Updates

Nick Martt provided an update on the workings of SEOW and OSAM. He reviewed the current behind the scenes changes being made to the website, and asked that viewers of SEOW alert him of any missing or distorted charts, graphs or data within the website during this time of transition. He also mentioned the Board-level reports being produced by SEOW as a detailed summary of AOD consumption and consequence issues and successes at the county and Board levels. The goal of these reports is to provide Board members with a quick reference to AOD trends within their communities. The reports will also be a great reference for the Boards' community plans, which are due in the coming months. Mr. Martt

plans to have 25 of the reports completed by August 31st, 2013. The remaining reports will be released as completed. All reports will be placed on the SEOW website.

Mr. Martt also gave updates regarding current projects and goals of the Ohio Substance Abuse Monitoring (OSAM) Network. The June 2012-January 2013 OSAM reports are currently online at the Ohio MHAS website, located at <http://mha.ohio.gov/>. Within the website, both SEOW and OSAM data can be found under Research, which is part of the Learning tab at the top of the main page. In addition, OSAM is currently working on the January 2013 to June 2013 reports, which will be available online as soon as possible. OSAM has begun work on a targeted response initiative (TRI) regarding the AOD and mental health issues facing Southeast Asians within the State of Ohio. OSAM is also developing a report regarding gambling among young adults and college students. Finally, Dr. Tom Sherba and Mr. Martt recently had an article regarding gambling among OSAM participants accepted for publication within the peer-reviewed Journal of Gambling Studies. We hope to have the article posted on the Ohio MHAS website very soon.

OSET Evaluation Update

Dr. Holly Raffle provided an update on the status of Ohio's SPF SIG sub-recipient communities. She mentioned that Ohio currently has 10 communities with approved Needs Assessments and 3 communities in the revision stage (see attached OSET Update 8/14/13). There are currently 4 sub-recipient communities that are continuing to work the SPF for a specific sub-target population. Most recently the Fairfield county SPF coalition decided not to implement a strategic plan for one of their underserved /sub-target populations. They have come to understand the value of this data driven process.

Dr. Raffle also discussed the community logic model process. There are currently 7/13 approved logic models. This process tends to happen quickly once a solid needs assessment has been approved. SPF SIG EBP Workgroup

Dr. Holly Raffle provided an update on the SPF EBP Workgroup. The SPF EBP Workgroup has been meeting monthly and has been doing a phenomenal job of reviewing logic models. The EBP prepared a position statement on Intervening Variables as well as Strategies in an effort to get communities to stay focused on what can realistically be accomplished with the time, money and personnel in their community. The SPF has allowed communities to have a comprehensive prevention portfolio that they can utilize with the 18-25 year old target population without duplicating current prevention efforts. The next EBP Meeting will be September 6th. Detailed information on the EBP Workgroup can be found in the EBP Workgroup Update 8/14/13 (see attached).

Alcohol Edu

Judi Moseley posed a question regarding AlcoholEdu and Nicole Yandell responded by providing an update on the AlcoholEdu project. Currently there are 6 Institutes of Higher Education (IHE) actively implementing this program. There was a Summit held on May 17, 2013 for all IHEs participating in the SPF SIG AlcoholEdu project. The Summit focused on their progress and sustainability efforts. Most of the communities are utilizing the AlcoholEdu program with their first year students. Ever-Fi continues to work directly with the IHEs and there has usually been about a 60% response rate for the first year of implementation and generally higher the following year. EverFi also offers various packages that include Sanctions as well as a Parent component. On 8/12/13 there was a sustainability conference call held

with all the SPF participating colleges. These calls will be held regularly to look at ways to strategically keep AlcoholEdu and/or some type of individual level AOD prevention programming on campus.

Nicole also informed the committee that it is time for the sub-recipients to begin the process of federal reporting with the CLI. The sub-recipient communities will be required to complete 2 parts. Part I will focus on where they are in the SPF process and Part II will focus on their plans for implementation. The CLI is due November 1st and emails have already been sent to the SPF SIG communities about the process and deadlines.

Additional Committee Updates

Elaine Georgas posed a question regarding the due date for logic models. Dawn Thomas and Dr. Raffle both responded that each community has a different due date based on when their Needs Assessment has been completed and approved. Both Dawn and Dr. Raffle stressed the importance of getting the logic models approved within the next few weeks so they could be presented at the next EBP committee meeting on September 6th.
