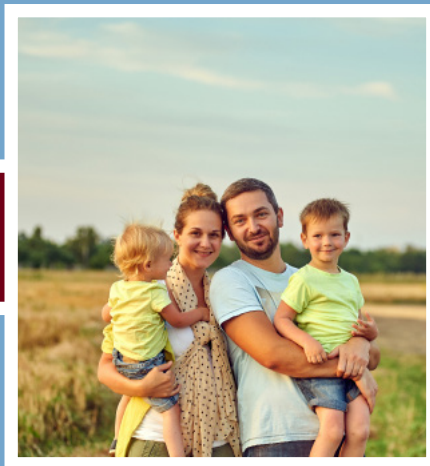

Ohio's State Opioid Response (SOR) Project 2.0

The Substance Abuse and Mental Health Services Administration (SAMSHA) awarded the State of Ohio approximately \$96M through the federal fiscal year (FFY) 2020 SOR program to develop tailored approaches to prevention, treatment, and recovery from opioid use disorders and/or stimulant use disorders. This is the second round of grant funding awarded through the SOR program. This new round of funding will allow the State of Ohio to expand upon the efforts planned for and implemented through the initial SOR 1.0 grant awarded in 2018.

The SOR 2.0 project is focused on building a community system of care that emphasizes integration between physical health, emergency health care, behavioral health care, criminal justice, and child welfare. These programs and services will build upon the work established by [Ohio's 21st Century CURES State Targeted Response Initiative](#).

Implementing SOR 2.0

SOR 2.0 funding will be distributed through state and local partnerships as pre-approved by SAMSHA. The majority of the funding will be used to reimburse local Alcohol, Drug Addiction, and Mental Health Services (ADAMHS) Boards for continuum of care projects based on requests for proposal (RFPs) submitted to the Department from a list of local funding priorities, found [here](#).

The grant will also be used to fund key state agency partnerships highlighted below.

- Ohio Department of Health: \$6.15M for overdose prevention strategies
- Ohio Board of Pharmacy: \$650K to address the misuse and diversion of prescription drugs through Ohio's prescription drug monitoring program
- Ohio Department of Veteran Services: \$1M to support training for veteran peers and outreach to connect veterans unable to access VA services
- Ohio Department of Job and Family Services: \$1.5M to support the OhioSTART program (Sobriety, Treatment and Reducing Trauma)
- Interagency Development: \$700K to enter into additional partnerships with state agencies or community partners

SOR 1.0 No Cost Extension

SAMSHA recently granted the state of Ohio a no cost extension to continue allocating funding from the SOR 1.0 grant. SOR 1.0 projects were delayed because the Boards had to shift short-term goals to respond to the pandemic. Because use of this grant money was pre-approved by SAMSHA, the Boards could not change the use of the funds and were unable to complete the projects through the end of FFY 20.

The remaining \$55.8M of the SOR 1.0 money will be used to complete programming for the purposes of the original grant, which include:

- Support for minority-focused efforts
- Support for healthy birth outcomes for babies born to mothers with OUD
- Support for Faith-Based efforts
- Support for Recovery Housing
- Support for overdose prevention, such as naloxone distribution

SERVICE OVERVIEW

TREATMENT

QRT/OCRT: respond to opioid overdoses to provide on scene screenings, treatment referrals, MAT linkage and crisis placement.

Residential Services: Ohio Valley Physicians to offer 3.5 and 3,7 level of care residential substance use disorder services.

MAT and Treatment Services: Shawnee Family Health will offer MAT and additional services in Lawrence county.

RECOVERY SUPPORTS

TCC Vocational program: offers vocational training for clients alongside treatment services and education.

Housing program: Initiate supports for Level III housing for substance use disorder clients.

Peer Support: Thrive will offer peer supports throughout the board area.

Providers: The Counseling Center, Shawnee Family Health Center, THRIVE peer support, Ohio Valley Physicians.

Highlight Innovative Programs: The Success Center developed to assist persons pre and post release from settings of incarceration. The curriculum focuses on skill building for job readiness, financial education, and life skills in courses such as workplace etiquette, backing, building credit and more. Courses support certification and employment in electric, plumbing, equipment operations, construction, auto mechanic, deck handing, and environmental services.

Highlight Cross System Collaborations: Building on the Quick Response Team integration of the Southern Ohio Medical Center and the Adams County Regional Medical Center with the existing Counseling Center 24/7 response team to include the Portsmouth Fire Department as a new partner. Persons who refuse medical care or Emergency Department transport will be offered a brief screening, referral to treatment, MAT linkage or other crisis placement services. The expansion will allow access to a larger proportion of the community missed in the current Emergency Department response.

Recovery Housing Specialist: Complete intake paperwork and assist with placements.

Employment EAP Navigator: Navigation to EAP services for employees of local businesses.

Thrive Peer Support at Mercy Health MAT Clinic: Linkage to peer support services.

Hep-C Clinic: Screening, education, and linkage to treatment for individuals Hepatitis C positive.

Providers: Mercy Health St. Rita's Medical Center, Allen County Children's Services and Family Resource Center, Coleman Professional Services, and We Care Regional Quality Recovery Housing LLC

Highlight Innovative Programs: Recovery Navigator, Family Stabilization Coordinator, Quick Response Team, Mobile Crisis, Jail Navigator, Emergency Department Navigator, Hep-C Clinic, and Health Equity Plan.

Target Population(s) Treatment Services: Adult domestic/sexual/dating Violence, stalking, and human trafficking survivors in the Ashland County Domestic Violence Shelter ('Safe Haven') and adult inmates in the Ashland County Jail. Provide co-occurring and SUD only treatment services in the jail and domestic violence shelter to reduce relapse and recidivism rates. Offer transportation and Navigator services to increase behavioral health treatment participation and involvement in key supportive services

RECOVERY

Ashland County adults in recovery housing, the domestic violence shelter or receiving services for opioid/stimulant use/misuse.

PREVENTION

Primary Prevention Services: Ashland County Youth in the K-12 System, Adults with criminal justice involvement, parents/caregivers/foster families involved with child protective services and adults/youth of targeted community partners.

JAIL

Provide co-occurring and SUD only treatment services in the jail and domestic violence shelter to reduce relapse and recidivism rates.

Providers: Appleseed, ACCADA, CCS, Spire Advertising

Highlight Innovative Programs: Individuals are targeted at all stages of development, starting from Kindergarten, on the life continuum for prevention services.

Criminal Justice Navigator: Screening and referral to care with individuals involved with the court

SERVICE OVERVIEW

TREATMENT

Court Intervention: Expand access to MAT while addressing social determinants of health and focusing on causal factors that trigger and exacerbate the disease cycle of addiction through assessment and evidence-based programming for justice involved clients.

Residential TREATMENT Expand access through OTP and residential support creating multiagency pathway to treatment including through the emergency department, overdose response team and harm reduction program. Further expand services to adolescents and their families through residential treatment and clinical support services.

MOMS (Maternal Opiate Medical Supports): provide MAT and clinical support wrap-around services to pregnant and post-partum women diagnosed with opioid or stimulant use disorder.

RECOVERY SUPPORTS

QRT/Peer Support: utilize a rapid access model combined with support to develop authentic relationships and facilitate referrals to community providers.

Housing supports: aid clients in gaining and maintaining housing in recovery housing, sober living settings and independent community living environments. Targeting both single adults and women and children.

PREVENTION/EARLY INTERVENTION

Athens Adolescent Outpatient Program: expand the existing, evidence-based program to provide early intervention/outpatient services, clinical support, and wrap around services to Appalachian students.

Providers: Athens Mental Health Inc., dba The Gathering Place; Serenity Grove; The John W. Clem Recovery House; Integrated Services for Behavioral Health (ISBH); Hopewell Health Centers, Inc. (HHC); TASC; Health Recovery Services (HRS)

Highlight Innovative Programs: The Health Recovery Services Athens Adolescent Outpatient Program (AAOP) offers ASAM Level 1 outpatient care and will expand to support early intervention, clinical support and wrap around services through a multidisciplinary, trauma informed team. The AAOP reduces transportation barriers and supports families who lack financial means and Medicaid support for services. The program works collaboratively with the school system to identify eligible families and children and overcomes barriers created by poverty and a family history of substance use.

Highlight Cross System Collaborations: Partnership between ISBH and the Vinton County Drug court for county, felony, and juvenile courts. Aid in finding housing, employment, and treatment for addiction to participants in the Drug Court Programs.

Partnership between O'Bleness Hospital emergency department, peer supporters and Hopewell Health Center to implement timely engagement and individualized care including induction onto MAT, engagement with peer support and build authentic relationships to support recovery.

SERVICE OVERVIEW

RECOVERY SUPPORTS

Peer Support: THRIVE peer support to engage persons in emergency departments after an overdose and those who are incarcerated. ASCENT will also provide non-clinical assistance for all residents through weekly peer supports and crisis prevention services.

Treatment and Recovery Resources Application: Using the GetHelpNow platform to provide information to first responders and the community regarding available treatment and supports. It provides quick access to crisis lines and connections to providers based on user input regarding location and services desired.

PREVENTION/EARLY INTERVENTION

Universal and Indicated Strategies for youth: Family Recovery Center will engage in coordinated prevention programming using the Strategic Prevention Framework to implement community prevention strategies. Data collection, partnerships with law enforcement, establishing a community drug prevention coalition and provide drug free workplace training.

Providers: Family Recovery Center, Ascend Innovations, Ascent powered by Sober Grid, THRIVE

Highlight Innovative Programs: The GetHelpNow application will be designed through partnerships with the board and treatment providers to ensure local providers of services across the continuum are available to all persons within the board area. The application provides information to support law enforcement and first responders who often desire to refer residents to services but are often unsure of the appropriate organization to contact. Using the direct interface through a mobile application will allow residents, first responders and law enforcement to access available resources at the moment they are needed.

Highlight Cross System Collaborations: THRIVE peer support will partner with area hospitals to engage with persons in the hospital struggling with opioid and/or stimulant use disorders. Thrive will also provide peer supporters to the three county jails for both male and female incarcerated individuals. The connection will continue through release from the hospital or the jail to assist in treatment, recovery supports and other services engagement.

Withdrawal Management: Stabilize the individual, begin MAT induction if warranted and connect to outpatient treatment and supports

RECOVERY SUPPORTS

Peer Support: Peer recovery specialists will provide transportation, supports, engage clients in treatment and encourage MAT

CRIMINAL JUSTICE

Jail & Court Treatment Navigation: Provide consultation, assessments, referrals to treatment and assist in engagement with MAT in county jail and municipal court

PREVENTION

Education and Stigma Reduction: family support for those with family members who have experienced substance use, prevention messaging via social media, Strengthening Families Program

Providers: Beckett Springs, Talbert House, Brown County Health Department, Child Focus, Brown County Drug & Major Crimes Task Force

EARLY INTERVENTION/OUTREACH

Harm Reduction Collaborative: In partnerships with the Project DAWN sites, as well as syringe exchange sites, the regional harm reduction collaborative will address needs in the community through the distribution of naloxone, supplies, and outreach across 5 counties.

TREATMENT

Extended Care and Rehabilitation provides those with co-occurring conditions access to clinicians with ability to assess, diagnose and treat SUD

RECOVERY SUPPORTS

Peer Support: Jail-based peer recovery specialists will engage clients in IOP, provide access to case management and post-release planning and recovery supports

Drop-In Engagement: this center will provide access to resources like Medicaid enrollment, driver's license and wrap around recovery supports

CRIMINAL JUSTICE

Jail SUD Treatment & Navigation: provide peer support, reentry planning/case management, warm handoff to recovery supports

PREVENTION

Education and Stigma Reduction: build a county-wide campaign focused on reducing stigma and engaging individuals and families including billboards, print materials, social media, and other promotional means.

Providers: Envision Partnerships, Sojourner, Access Counseling Services, Community Behavioral Health, DeCoach Rehabilitation Centers, HOUSE

Highlight Innovative Programs: Harm Reduction Collaborative is a 5-county initiative that provides a mobile unit and staffing to a syringe exchange, Narcan education

Highlight Cross System Collaborations: Prevention messaging is a collaboration between the health department, local prevention coalition and the addiction task force

After engagement the case managers support women throughout their pregnancy and delivery becoming a support and an advocate to ensure a healthy, stable family for the newborn.

Highlight Cross System Collaborations: New partnerships through the collaborative approach taken across the six-county region include partnerships with Muskingum County Adult and Child Protective Services and the Muskingum County Juvenile Court. Within the region medical providers serve as both referral sources and partners including Genesis Health care System, Southeastern Med, Coshocton Regional Medical Center, and county health departments. Integration with county courts and child welfare partnerships exist across the region and provide referrals to participating agencies and collaborative support for participants.
