

Disposition at Discharge – Field Summary

The OBHIS discharge record specifies 18 conditions under which a client can be discharged. These 18 conditions can be collapsed into the five categories of Successful, Unsuccessful, Neutral, Referral, and Assessment and Evaluation Only. See Table 1 for details.

Unsuccessful	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Left on own against staff advice without satisfactory progress • Involuntarily discharged due to non-participation • Involuntarily discharged due to violation of rules • Incarcerated due to offense committed while in treatment/recovery with satisfactory/unsatisfactory progress
Neutral	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Left on own against staff advice with satisfactory progress • Incarcerated due to old warrant/charge before entering treatment with/without satisfactory progress • Transferred to another facility for health reasons • Death • Client moved • Needed services not available • Other
Referral	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Referred to another program or service with/without satisfactory progress
Assessment Only	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Successfully completed/no further services recommended • Client rejected recommendations
