What is The Joint Commission?

The Joint Commission is an independent, not-for-profit national accrediting body. Established more than 50 years ago, The Joint Commission sets the standards by which health care quality is measured in America and around the world.

To achieve accreditation by The Joint Commission, the organizations must submit to a thorough on-site review by The Joint Commission professionals. Participating in the accreditation process is entirely voluntary. This means the participating organization must choose to be measured against national standards for excellence in providing quality patient care. Joint Commission accreditation means that our organization complies with the highest national standards for safety and quality of care.

We encourage members of the general public, families, patients, or other individuals who have a concern regarding patient care or safety, to notify the staff on duty, or any member of our management team.
