Meeting called to order, welcome, introductions, review of Meeting Rules and approval of meeting minutes –

Jennilee Mohler, Planning Council Chairperson

- The minutes from the October 19, 2018 meeting were reviewed and approved unanimously

CFPT Form Guidelines – Sharon Fitzpatrick, OhioMHAS Community Recovery Initiatives Administrator

- Sharon acknowledged the delay of the Oct. 19th payments and gave an update on when the checks were mailed
- Review of the CFPT Guidelines highlighting the review, approval and payment processes
- Review of completion of CFPT forms stressed the importance of completing the form thoroughly and accurately
- Remember to include the attachment of MapQuest documentation in order to expedite the process
- Current mileage reimbursement rate is \$.52/mile (only if you drove and did not ride with other people)
- Jennilee reminded committee members to submit CFPT forms for committee telephone meetings
- Sharon will make minor corrections to the current form and then forward to Planning Council

Advocacy Panel Discussion - Dustin McKee, NAMI; Jordan Ballinger, Disability Rights Ohio; Lauren Baker, OCAAR

- Panelists shared briefly about their agency
- Discussed both personal advocacy as well as role of local, state and national advocacy
- Importance of building relationships and having individuals with lived experience at the table
- OCAAR offers free online training – Advocacy 101
- Most effective advocates have gone through some training in how to share their story, so people will receive it, and how to communicate effectively in order to connect with your audience
- Finding like-minded people
- Influence of communicating facts/data vs stories – need to find a balance
- Tailor your message to your audience and engaging the other person in the process
- Indicators that let you know you're making progress – may start with the fact that people are having conversations about issues they weren't talking about before
- Understand the landscape is always changing and you must work for the long game

SOR/CURES Grants Updates - Sanford Starr, Deputy Director, Quality, Planning & Research at OhioMHAS

- State Targeted Response (STR) – halfway through this 2-year grant to address the opiate crisis
 - In process of awarding carryover dollars (from year 1) to boards to continue with their projects
- State Opiate Response (SOR) - New 55-million-dollar grant – Boards are asked to collaborate with other boards
- Interagency Agreements to facilitate collaboration with other state agencies
 - Ohio Dept. of Health (Project Dawn and Naloxone distribution)
 - Ohio Dept. of Pharmacy OARS systems – linking with a referral system

- ODJFS – providing additional funds for employment for individuals in recovery
- Child Welfare – expanding START programs (family peers for those in court system)
- Continuing education for physicians and workforce development with clinical staff
