


# Treatment for Opiate Use Disorder

## Percentage of Unduplicated Clients in SFY 2013

### Map Information:

This map represents the percentage of unduplicated clients with a primary diagnosis of opiate use disorder (OUD) served in each county during SFY 2013. The average rate of clients with a primary diagnosis of OUD across counties was 30.4%. The highest rates were found in Scioto county (75.3%), Lawrence county (73.8%), Gallia county (61.8%), and Jackson county (61.6%). The lowest rates were found in Tuscarawas county (10.3%), Coshocton county (12.0%), and Darke county (13.0%).

Counties that reported fewer than 25 clients are signified by gray, and no rate is given. Counties with 25-49 clients are signified by diagonal lines.

County borders are outlined in gray. ADAMHS Boards areas are outlined in black, and may overlap county borders.
