


Treatment for Cocaine Use Disorder

Percentage of Unduplicated Clients in SFY 2014



Map Information:

This map represents the percentage of unduplicated clients with a primary diagnosis of cocaine use disorder (CUD) served in each county during SFY 2014. The average rate of clients with a primary diagnosis of CUD across counties was 14.8%. The highest rates were found in Cuyahoga county (32.3%), Lucas county (27.1%), Montgomery county (25.9%), and Lorain county (14.8%). The lowest rates were found in Lawrence county (3.4%), Scioto county (4.6%), and Knox county (7.4%). Counties that reported fewer than 25 clients are signified by gray, and no rate is given. Counties with 25-49 clients are signified by diagonal lines. County borders are outlined in gray. ADAMHS Boards areas are outlined in black, and may overlap county borders.
