


# Treatment for Opiate Use Disorder

## Percentage of Unduplicated Clients in SFY 2014

### Map Information:

This map represents the percentage of unduplicated clients with a primary diagnosis of opiate use disorder (OUD) served in each county during SFY 2014. The average rate of clients with a primary diagnosis of OUD across counties was 38.6%. The highest rates were found in Lawrence county (86.9%), Scioto county (86.0%), and Gallia county (73.0%). The lowest rates were found in Coshocton county (10.2%), Tuscarawas county (14.2%), and Geauga county (18.1%).

Counties that reported fewer than 25 clients are signified by gray, and no rate is given. Counties with 25-49 clients are signified by diagonal lines.

County borders are outlined in gray. ADAMHS Boards areas are outlined in black, and may overlap county borders.
