


# Treatment for Alcohol Use Disorder

## Percentage of Unduplicated Clients in SFY 2016

#### Percentage of clients




### Map Information:

This map represents the percentage of unduplicated clients with a primary diagnosis of alcohol use disorder (AUD) served in each county during SFY 2016. The average rate of clients with a primary diagnosis of AUD across counties was 20.3%. The highest rates were found in Putnam county (40.4%), Holmes county (40.2%), and Carroll county (39.9%). The lowest rates were found in Scioto county (5.2%), Lawrence county (7.4%), and Hardin county (9.6%).

Counties that reported fewer than 25 clients are signified by gray, and no rate is given. Counties with 25-49 clients are signified by diagonal lines.

County borders are outlined in gray. ADAMHS Boards areas are outlined in black, and may overlap county borders.
