

Hospital Admission Rates for Opiate-related Diagnoses per 10,000 Persons

Map Information:

This map examines hospital admission rates for opiate abuse, dependence or poisoning among persons admitted from emergency rooms into inpatient or observation settings as well as those persons treated and released from emergency rooms. On average, there were 16.5 hospital admissions per 10,000 persons statewide between 2004 and 2008. Counties with the highest hospital admission rates were Gallia (53.6), Montgomery (37.2) and Jackson (25.2). Lawrence (1.1), Mercer (2.0) and Putnam (2.4) counties had the lowest hospital admission rates associated with opiate-related diagnoses.

Note: Alcohol, Drug Addiction and Mental Health Services (ADAMHS) Boards have black borders, and counties have white borders. Borders are black in cases where ADAMHS boards and counties have the same borders.
