Map Information:

This map displays opiate possession charges (i.e., Rx opioid and heroin) per 10,000 persons by county. In 2011 there were 3,962 charges for opiate possession across the state. Montgomery (17.1), Summit (10.4) and Meigs (9.7) counties had the highest rates of opiate possession charges per 10,000 persons. Allen, Carroll, Knox, Lawrence, Lucas, Morgan, Perry and Putnam counties reported few arrests for opiate possession. Four other counties reported no charges for opiate possession, likely the result of not submitting possession data in 2011.

Note: Alcohol, Drug Addiction and Mental Health Services (ADAMHS) Boards have black borders, and counties have white borders. Borders are black in cases where ADAMHS boards and counties have the same borders.
