Map Information:

This map represents the percentage of unduplicated clients in treatment who list heroin as a primary drug of choice by county of residence. In SFY 2013, 9,029 clients (18.5%) listed this substance as a primary drug of choice. Counties with the highest percentages of clients reporting heroin as a drug of choice were Marion (45.0%), Knox (36.8%) and Butler (34.8%) Guernsey (1.5%), Hancock (2.1%) and Ottawa (3.4%) counties had the fewest clients reporting this drug of choice. Percentages are not displayed for counties with fewer than 25 admissions.

Note: Alcohol, Drug Addiction and Mental Health Services (ADAMHS) Boards have black borders, and counties have white borders. Borders are black in cases where ADAMHS boards and counties have the same borders.
