


# Prescription Opioid Doses Dispensed per Patient

Ohio's Automated Rx Reporting System - 2019

## Map Information:

This map displays the number of prescription opioid doses dispensed per patient in each county in 2019. Per patient measures are based on the number of patients in a county who received opioid prescriptions.

The 2019 statewide average opioid doses dispensed per patient was 234.3. The counties with the highest numbers of dispensed doses per patient were Vinton county (368.1), Jackson county (337.1), and Pike county, (336.9). The counties with the lowest numbers of dispensed doses per patient were Holmes county, (130.7), Ashland county (173.4), and Williams county (173.9).

Doses include opioid oral solids, sublingual films, and transdermal patches. All opioid solutions are excluded from the analyses. County borders are outlined in gray. ADAMHS Boards areas are outlined in black, and may overlap county borders.
