>>> Governor Commits \$2 Million to Children's Health Research

Gov. John R. Kasich announced today that he will pledge an additional \$2 million to support shared medical research among children's hospitals in Ohio. The funds will be divided between two research projects, with \$1 million being used to study asthma treatment options for children and another \$1 focused on pediatric pneumonia diagnoses. The research will be funded with federal dollars that Ohio was awarded for enrolling more eligible children in Medicaid and the Children's Health Insurance Program. Gov. Kasich committed \$2 million in 2011 as well to support collaborative research among the hospitals on children's health issues.

The Alcohol and Drug Abuse Prevention Association of Ohio ([ADAPAO](#)) will host **Ohio's Opiate Epidemic: The Prevention Response** on May 6 at The Boat House at Confluence Park in Columbus. The focus of the conference is learning and dialoguing about prevent strategies to address opiate abuse and addiction. Governor's Cabinet Opiate Action Team Deputy Director Andrea Boxill and ADAPAO Executive Director Jim Ryan are among the presenters, along with a host of Ohio's prevention and other behavioral health experts.
