>>> State of Ohio Receives \$11.9M Grant to Expand Affordable Housing Options

In an effort to provide more affordable housing choices and prevent Ohioans with disabilities from being institutionalized or facing homelessness, the U.S. Department of Housing and Urban Development (HUD) awarded the Ohio Housing Finance Agency (OHFA) \$11.9 million of new federal funding to support a five-year rental assistance program. OHFA, in partnership with the Ohio Department of Medicaid (ODM), will administer rental assistance contracts for 508 housing units and coordinate supportive services for households which earn 30 percent less than the area median income, and have at least one person who suffers from physical disabilities, intellectual and/or developmental disabilities or chronic mental illness. ODM, with assistance from the Ohio Department of Developmental Disabilities (DODD) and the Ohio Department of Mental Health and Addiction Services (OhioMHAS), will create and maintain a referral network to match persons in need with available housing units throughout the state.

>>> **Ohio Trauma Experts Invited to Present at 2015 Coalition for Juvenile Justice Conference**

Patrick Canary and Dr. Jeff Kretschmar from the Begun Center for Violence Prevention Education and Research at Case Western Reserve University and Kim Kehl, OhioMHAS' Trauma-Informed Care (TIC) coordinator, have been invited to deliver a workshop on "Building Trauma-Informed System of Care" at the [2015 Coalition on Juvenile Justice Conference](#) in Washington D.C. June 10-13. The team will present an overview of current literature and knowledge regarding trauma and adolescent behavioral health development, particularly for youth involved in the juvenile justice system. To effectively divert, intervene and reduce contact with the juvenile justice system, the compelling behavioral health and trauma-related conditions of these youth must be addressed. The workshop will use examples from a number of Ohio initiatives addressing these issues at the clinical, systems and policy levels. Ohio's Behavioral Health Juvenile Justice Projects and results from a longitudinal study will be key highlights of the workshop.

"The more we understand the life experiences of the whole youth, including their trauma, the better we will be able to determine what types of responses and interventions are most effective," said Canary, the lead presenter. "We have come to understand the complex role that trauma plays in the bio-psychological development of young people. The more we can orient our systems and practices to be 'trauma-informed' the better the outcomes will be for everyone."
