>>> Maternal Opiate Medical Supports (MOMS) Trainer Grant (MHA-19-MEDDIR-MOMSTrainer-46)

The Ohio Department of Mental Health and Addiction Services (OhioMHAS) seeks to award funding (\$65,000) to one entity to provide training on the Maternal Opiate Medical Supports ([MOMS](#)) model of care for pregnant women with opioid use disorder. The awardee will be responsible for helping seven current and three new Opiate Treatment Programs (OTPs) develop an integrated maternal care home model of care, utilizing the MOMS toolkit to support clinical practices for this population, and conducting ongoing training and technical assistance with the OTPs. The awardee will be expected to hold live, in-person and web-based training events in consultation with OhioMHAS. Additionally, the awardee will be required to provide at least one MOMS service to pregnant women with opioid use disorder (e.g., contracting with OB to provide services on site). Awardee will participate in evaluation of MOMS services. Applications must be submitted to CURESTREATMENT@mha.ohio.gov by **5:30 p.m. on Aug. 27**.
