>>> RFA: FY 19 Maternal Opiate Medical Support (MOMS) Trainer Grant (MHA-MEDDIR-MOMSTRAINER-46)

The Ohio Department of Mental Health and Addiction Services (OhioMHAS) seeks to award funding to one entity to provide training on the Maternal Opiate Medical Supports ([MOMS](#)) model of care for pregnant women with opioid use disorder. The awardee will be responsible for helping seven current and three new Opiate Treatment Programs (OTPs) develop an integrated maternal care home model of care, utilizing the MOMS toolkit to support clinical practices for this population, and conducting ongoing training and technical assistance with the OTPs. The awardee will be expected to hold live, in-person and web-based training events in consultation with OhioMHAS. Additionally, the awardee will be required to provide at least one MOMS service to pregnant women with opioid use disorder (e.g., contracting with OB to provide services on site). Awardee will participate in evaluation of MOMS services. Applications must be submitted to CURESTREATMENT@mha.ohio.gov by 5:30 p.m. on July 27. >>> Deadline Extended: Maternal Opiate Medical Supports Grant (MHA-19-MEDDIR-MOMS-40)

OhioMHAS seeks to award funding to support three federally licensed opioid treatment program (OTP) providers and/or OhioMHAS licensed behavioral health providers with co-located Medication-Assisted Treatment to implement and provide Maternal Opiate Medical Supports Services ([MOMS](#)) to pregnant women with opioid use disorder. Awardees will develop an integrated maternal care home model of care utilizing the MOMS toolkit to support clinical practices for this population. Awardees will be responsible for participating in training and technical assistance events, learning communities, co-locating OB/GYN services, and coordinating with managed care plans and other entities (e.g., accountable care organizations (ACOs), comprehensive primary care centers (CPCs), and federally qualified health centers (FQHCs)) to encourage program sustainability. Additionally, awardees will participate in an evaluation of MOMS services. **The deadline to apply has been extended until 5 p.m. on July 6.** Applications must be submitted to CURESTREATMENT@mha.ohio.gov.
