>>> New Form for Emergency Admissions

Effective Sept. 28, [Ohio Revised Code Section 5122.10](#) (Emergency Hospitalization) has changed to include two new categories of professionals who can sign a “pink slip”: clinical nurse specialists, certified as psychiatric-mental health CNS by the American nurses credentialing center; and certified nurse practitioners, certified as psychiatric-mental health NP by the American nurses credentialing center. >>> FY 19 RFP: Community Collective Impact Model for Change (MHA-10-PW-CommunityImpact2-48)

The Ohio Department of Mental Health and Addiction Services (OhioMHAS) is pleased to [announce](#) a six-month funding opportunity (MHA-10-PW-CommunityImpact2-48) to support the development of a community-level comprehensive prevention plan for opioid use, misuse, abuse, and overdose deaths and the integration of a collective impact approach to address community-level trauma. Building off the work of the Community Collective Impact Model for Change (CCIM4C) Initiative's Cohort 1, OhioMHAS is offering a funding and training opportunity for organizations interested in developing a new, or building on an existing, data-driven prevention plan to address opioid misuse and abuse. The comprehensive prevention plan will be grounded in the Strategic Prevention Framework and the Collective Impact Model and include a three-pronged approach to prevention – demand reduction, supply reduction, and consequence mitigation. This opportunity will also provide training on utilizing a collective impact framework to address wicked problems in communities, such as opioid misuse and abuse, as well as community-level trauma. Selection for participation in this opportunity will include a grant award as well as training, technical assistance, and professional development for participants. Grantees will include certified prevention organizations, government entities, community coalitions/task forces, ADAMHS/CMH/ADAS Boards, institutes of higher education in Ohio, non-profit organizations, hospitals and federally qualified health centers, foundations, and the business community. Proposals must be submitted to MHAS-OPWGRANTS@mha.ohio.gov by **5 p.m. on Oct. 26**. All questions must be submitted to the same email address by noon on Oct. 24.
