Specialized Docket Subsidy Program	The Specialized Docket Subsidy Program Assists drug courts and other specialized dockets serving individuals with substance use disorders with funding to effectively manage offenders in the community, thereby reducing commitments to the state prison system. Funding can be used for administrative costs, treatment services, recovery supports and medication assisted treatment	OhioMHAS distributes funding to approximately 140 specialized dockets, in 42 counties.	Funds are allocated to ADAMH Boards.
Legacy Drug Court Program	Legacy Drug Court programs fund 23 courts in 17 counties for comprehensive supervision, drug testing, treatment services, sanctions, and incentives.	Drug Courts in 17 counties are included in the program: Belmont, Butler, Clermont, Cuyahoga, Delaware, Fairfield, Franklin, Hamilton, Logan, Lorain, Lucas, Mahoning, Miami, Montgomery, Morrow, Richland, Summit.	Grant funds are distributed to ADAMH Boards or provider agencies.
Addiction Treatment Program (ATP)	The ATP provides addiction treatment and recovery support services to clients involved with selected drug court or family dependency dockets, having an opioid and/or alcohol addiction, and deemed eligible for Medication-assisted treatment (MAT). Treatment is provided by a community addiction services provider certified by OhioMHAS.	Drug and family dependency courts in 54 counties are included in the program.	Funds are allocated to ADAMH Boards.

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Community Transition Program (CTP)	The CTP program offers eligible individuals returning home from prison a transitional benefit for drug and alcohol treatment and assistance with recovery support services such as housing, transportation, work and education. Other areas of recovery support include peer recovery support, life skills development, relapse prevention/recovery, spiritual support and help with gathering necessary identification documentation.	As of June 2018, close to 5,000 eligible individuals have enrolled in CTP. There are 77 agency partners providing coverage in 73 counties.	Funds are allocated to Care-Source to manage the program.
Mental Health Prison Reentry Program	The Mental Health Prison Reentry Program funding to ADAMH Board areas to expand treatment and recovery support services for individuals with a SMI leaving prison.	40 of Ohio's ADAMH Boards are participating in this program.	One time funding was allocated to ADAMH Boards that choose to participate in the program.
Criminal Justice and Behavioral Health Linkage Program	The Criminal Justice and Behavioral Health Linkage program encourages communities in Ohio to forge collaborative relationships between the behavioral health and criminal justice systems so that individuals with mental illness and/or alcohol and other drug addiction receive the care they need. This, in turn, helps to reduce recidivism, increase public safety and minimize harm to those who come in contact with law enforcement.	35 of Ohio's ADAMH Boards are participating in this program.	Funds are allocated to ADAMH Boards.
