## Overview

The Department is committed to providing a comprehensive continuum of alcohol and other drug (AOD) treatment services. The continuum begins at DRC reception centers where inmates receive an AOD screening. For inmates with AOD problems, the next phase of the AOD treatment continuum is provided at parent institutions. A variety of treatment services are offered based on the institutional mission, physical capacity and staffing. Inmate participation in these programs is voluntary. In fiscal year 2005 there were 32 correctional institutions in full operation.

Upon completion of a treatment program, the counselor works with the inmate to develop a continuing care plan. This plan will include participation in institutional AOD aftercare activities while incarcerated and community care when released. AOD services for offenders under DRC supervision in the community are coordinated by eight Chemical Dependency Specialists (CDS). The CDS' are responsible for developing treatment resources, making referrals, providing AOD assessments and interim services. They also provide training and technical assistance to APA staff. In fiscal year 2005, the CDS' made 3,095 referrals to community treatment agencies.

## FY '05 Highlights

- Intensive Program Prison (IPP) Expansion

Two Alcohol and Other Drug (AOD) programs were added to the Department's existing sentence reduction programs. The AOD programs (NCCTF – 48 bed, PCI – 30 bed) offer a ninety day intensive curriculum for eligible offenders.

- 136 ODRC staff attended the Ohio Alcohol and Drug Studies Institute conference held at the Ohio University in Athens, Ohio.
- ODRC, Bureau of Recovery Services and the Ohio Department of Alcohol and Drug Addiction Services (ODADAS) in collaboration with Treatment Alternatives to Safer Communities (TASC) placed TASC Coordinators at the three reception centers to facilitate screening and identification of eligible offenders for IPP and Therapeutic Community (TC) placement.


Two Alumni Coordinators were hired to facilitate reentry activities of offenders returning home following completion of a TC program.

- The Bureau of Recovery Services in conjunction with the Great Lakes Addiction Technology Transfer Center (GLATTC) conducted a Training of Trainers. A total of 16 Recovery Services staff completed the training designed to improve training skills, lesson plan development, and the delivering of cognitive behavior treatment.
- Cognitive Behavioral Therapy AOD programs were developed and implemented in all institutions.
- Developed TC Family Component lesson plan to be implemented in the Department's 4 TC institutions.
- 46 institutional AOD programs and 84 community AOD programs were approved as reentry programs.




## ODRC Inmate Participants in AOD Programming Number and Percent of Participants in FY 2005
