

**Questions related to the MOMS OTP Implementation Grant – Request for Applicants
Number (MHA-18-MEDDIR-MOMSOTP-25)**

Q: I have been working for the past year to get a MOMS Program started in our County. We hired consultants in March to work with all of the key stakeholders in our community and are in the process of putting together a full implementation plan. I have been tracking the number of infants exposed since 2009, so I know we meet the numbers threshold. The RFP states that eligible applicants must be from: "federally licensed opioid treatment programs". I'm not aware of this licensure? Can you please provide the details? My providers are certified; nationally accredited and able to bill Medicaid.

A: Only programs that have a federal license accredited by SAMHSA, the DEA, and our organization may apply. Eligible applicants may be found on this list when you select "Ohio."

Q: Does the proposal allow for the designation of an internal case manager to perform case management and facilitate relationships with other service providers as deemed necessary to the client, or is it necessary/a requirement to involve a third party case management provider as a care team partner?

A: An internal case manager may provide the care coordination services as long as he/she is able to coordinate all MOMS services (i.e., primary healthcare, obstetric care, behavioral healthcare, child welfare, etc.).

Q: Are there any additional meeting requirements for the care coordination team outside those indicated in the learning community?

A: Awardees may be asked to meet in a face-to-face statewide meeting twice during the term of the grant.
