The ADAMH Board of _____ intends to **accept the role** to convene community partners to assist local school districts in planning for use of allocation funding to support K-12 Prevention Education initiatives in school districts within our Board area.

The ADAMH Board of _____ **declines to accept the role** to convene community partners to assist local school districts in planning for use of this allocation funding to support K-12 Prevention Education initiatives.

By accepting this role regarding the allocation, the ADAMH Board understands that it will be responsible for:

- participating in an informational webinar **November 19, 2019 at 1 pm** or reviewing the recording
- assisting districts with identifying potential partners** that could support planning and implementation for the school district's continuum of prevention, early intervention and support strategies
- coordinating a planning process with local school districts, educational service centers and community partners
- supporting districts in completing an on-line self-assessment survey tool provided by OhioMHAS that will be available by **December 3, 2019** (instructional webinar scheduled)
- collaborating with Educational Service Centers to meet the professional development needs of staff
- helping districts in the response and submission of the online plan of action surveys prior to **June 30, 2020**
- identifying a process for and approving district plans of action
- identifying a process for distribution of funds after district plans have been approved
- ensuring that each district receiving funding completes and submits a brief online K-12 Prevention Education Funding Implementation Report **by July 30, 2020**.

The ADAMH Board understands that these funds are to be utilized by the school districts to help build resiliency in children and reduce risk factors that contribute to behavioral health conditions. Boards will collaborate with OhioMHAS staff and local community partners to ensure that these dollars will support the development or expansion of school-based prevention activities benefitting local students. The board further understands that these partnerships and district plans could also support additional opportunities for implementing a broad continuum of interventions and professional development for school personnel.

**Planning Partners can include, but are not limited to: prevention providers, community coalitions, county boards of health, community-based mental health and substance use disorder providers, county department of job and family services, county boards of developmental disabilities, nonprofit organizations with experience serving children, public hospital agencies, and Family and Children First Councils.
