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## Getting to Behavioral Health Services

The Ohio Department of Mental Health and Addiction Services understands the stress and challenges that the COVID-19 pandemic has created. We know that ongoing access to care is vitally important to good health and recovery. While many services can currently be accessed through various technology options, such as by video or telephone, there are some services and conditions that are better assessed and treated in person with your health and behavioral health providers.

### Staying safe while traveling

Many transportation service providers are using health and safety precautions. Schedules may be altered during this time period, and the number of riders on public transit has been reduced. Drivers and riders are required to wear protective face masks and practice social distancing. Many public bus systems may require you to enter through the rear door or have installed clear barriers around the drivers. This is all for your protection. It is nothing to fear.

The busses are cleaned frequently, but once you leave the bus or other transportation service, you should wash your hands thoroughly and avoid touching your face, nose and eyes while out in public.

If you are sick, have a fever and cough, you should stay home and contact your primary care provider.
